CAMPUS REDEVELOPMENT

Overview

The NSW Government is investing an unprecedented \$720 million to redevelop the Prince of Wales Hospital and progress the vision of Randwick as a world-leading centre for health and wellbeing, research, education and teaching.

The redevelopment will provide:

- a new emergency department
- extra beds
- new shared operating theatres, and
- expanded rehabilitation and ambulatory care facilities.

Masterplanning for a dedicated mental health precinct has been completed.

The new hospital will provide a clinical core to the Randwick Hospital Campus that enables it to play a critical part in the overall Randwick Health and Education Super Precinct.














THE NEED

The Randwick Campus Redevelopment is being driven by:

- The need for space: By 2037 the hospital will need up to 50% more land than is available on the current campus to meet demand for health, education and research services.
- The need for a safe, efficient and quality service: About 60% of the buildings on the current hospital campus are over 30 years old. This is impacting the quality and cost of service delivery.
- The need to integrate health services and research: Quality health services emerge from cutting-edge research and teaching and is enhanced by bringing innovative research to the bedside.
- The need to plan effectively for the future: Integrating the planning of health and education facilities will improve services, and create high-value jobs and liveable places that support a growing Sydney.

The opportunity

The arrival of Sydney Light Rail has created a generational opportunity to revitalise High Street and create a new emergency access.

The redevelopment will expand and reorientate the Prince of Wales Hospital to the west, relocating the emergency entrance, creating space to construct a new, modern and efficient clinical core, and freeing up High Street to build upon the opportunities presented by Light Rail.

The expanded campus will physically connect the hospital to the University of New South Wales, integrating research and teaching facilities to create one of the largest concentration of clinical, scientific and academic minds in Australia.

The bigger picture

The Randwick Campus is critical to supporting Sydney as it grows significantly over the next 40 years.

It has the potential to become a hub of leading-edge research that attracts local, national and international talent, creates quality jobs, delivers exceptional healthcare and fosters innovation which builds upon research outputs.

It can also act as a catalyst for affordable housing, transport connections, social infrastructure and open space that services growing numbers of workers, students, local business and residents.

That's why the Greater Sydney Commission has designated Randwick as a Health and Education Precinct with the expectation that collaboration across government, with the community and with private sector delivers on this potential.



Collaboration

RANDWICK CAMPUS

The Randwick Campus Redevelopment is being led by Health Infrastructure in collaboration with the South Eastern Sydney Local Health District and Randwick Campus partners.

The campus partners include:

- Prince of Wales Hospital
- The Sydney Children's Hospital, Randwick
- University of New South Wales
- Royal Hospital for Women
- Eastern Suburbs Mental Health Services

Project timeline

In March 2015, The NSW Government committed \$500m to begin planning for the Randwick Campus Redevelopment. During 2016, precinct and campus partners collaborated on the Greater Randwick Urban Masterplan - a high-level framework to guide priorities across the precinct.

In parallel, Health Infrastructure prepared a Preliminary Business Case that identified options for the clinical core of the Randwick Campus. The Preliminary Business Case was informed by the Masterplan and was submitted to Government in March 2017.

In June 2017, the NSW Government committed an additional \$220 million to progress the vision for a Randwick Health and Education Precinct. This has meant planning for this critical project can forge ahead and enter a schematic design phase as illustrated by the diagram below.

Health Infrastructure will submit a Final Business Case to the NSW Government in late 2017.
