



LINK BRIDGE AND LINK ROAD WORKS

You may have noticed hoarding in place across the Level 1 link bridge connecting Building A to Building B. As we near completion of the new clinical services building, the link bridge will re-open to overlook the grand staircase in hospital street. You can see the link bridge from inside hospital street in the above image.

Following completion of the Level 1 works, the Level 2 link bridge A-B will be temporarily closed for similar connections to take place. The MET team have been consulted during planning for these works as the path of travel to ICU will be impacted while hoarding is in place.

Our builders are also finalising the pedestrian pathways and road connections to the new clinical services building, which will see temporary changed traffic conditions along the internal road. Access to visitor and staff parking from 27 April to 5 May will be via the detour to the Therry Road entrance. Alternatively, enter the campus via the new Appin Road entrance.
