

## Falling in love with the new building

It's 2022 and the countdown is on for the opening of the new clinical services building. There are big changes coming and we can't wait to show you your new hospital. As Valentine's Day approaches, all eyes are on our new building and the internal fitout – after all, it's what's on the inside that counts!

The future main entrance is nearing completion, with the terrazzo flooring installed and the bridges to the existing hospital currently being connected. Known as Hospital Street, the entrance will cascade across two levels and house concierge, security, retail vendors, waiting areas, lift lobbies and more.

Artist Erica Seccombe has designed a large artwork to adorn the Hospital Street staircase and lower corridor area. Harnessing the power of art, this soon-to-be unveiled feature piece celebrates the building's connection to nature and aims to help create a healing environment within this central hospital space.

### Aboriginal Elders visit the site

Aboriginal Elders and community members came on site in late January to help set up the orientation for the future healing circle, located outside the new clinical services building.

Designed in consultation and collaboration with our Elders and community, the healing circle will be a place where people can go to reflect, rewind and reconnect with nature.

The ceremony of giving thanks to our grandfather sun made the orientation of this space of upmost importance – ensuring the circle captures the sunrise to the east and the sunset to the west.

With special trees and stones selected, the space will acknowledge the connection between Campbelltown Hospital and Dharawal Country, recognising more than 60,000 years of Aboriginal culture in the region.

A place of peace and calm for patients, staff, visitors and the wider community, this space will be a healing place for all.

## Appin Road entrance

The new campus entrance off Appin Road is set to open in coming months. Providing easier access to the new hospital building, the new entrance will see the closure of the current driveway a little further up the road.

Our builders will soon be resurfacing the internal road which will see sections temporarily converted to one-way and access to the P4 staff car park reduced to one entry/exit point while works take place.

A traffic control plan will help vehicles and pedestrians navigate around the works. You may notice some noise, dust, vibration and an increase in construction vehicles at varying times within and around the area.
