The Discharge Lounge moved last week and is now on Level 2 of the new building. With direct external access, the dedicated car park is accessed at the east end of the one-way road outside the new main entrance, with spaces for Patient Transport. Called South Road, this road also has special drop-off and pick-up areas.

To further streamline access through the new main entrance, the public bus stop will also move to South Road on Thursday 16 June.

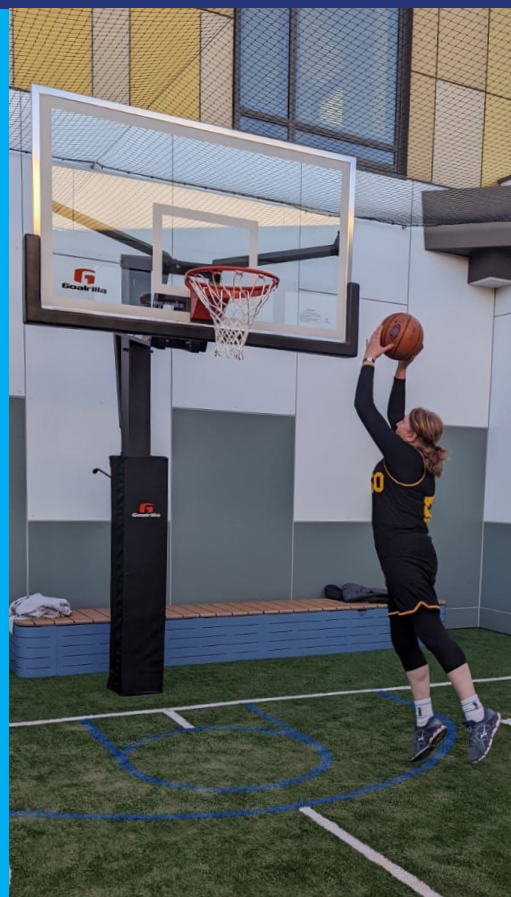

If you've taken the new staff walkway from the P4 car park to the new building recently, you may have noticed the Healing Circle. Designed in consultation and collaboration with our Aboriginal Elders and community, the healing circle will be a place where people can go to reflect, rewind and reconnect with nature.

The ceremony of giving thanks to our grandfather sun made the orientation of this space of upmost importance – ensuring the circle captures the sunrise to the east and the sunset to the west. With special trees and stones selected, the space will acknowledge the connection between Campbelltown Hospital and Dharawal Country, recognising more than 60,000 years of Aboriginal culture in the region. A place of peace and calm for patients, staff, visitors and the wider community, this space will be a healing place for all.
